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A grade of C- or better must be earned in order for a class to transfer.

Courses listed in the right column reflect the *recommended* or *preferred* course or course of action to take for transfer, based on alignment with the two year degree and PNCA's curriculum.

**Italicized notes* indicate a broader range of acceptable course options that may also fulfill the requirement, though they may not offer as strong a match as the recommended course or course of action recommended.

PNCA's Transfer Pathways are designed as complete, pre-approved sequences. Due to differences in quarter and semester credit systems, combined course content, and specific course approvals, the pathway must be followed in full to ensure all credits transfer as intended.

Most studio courses taken at Community Colleges that do not meet the PNCA Foundation Studio courses will transfer in as Studio Electives. This pathway is designed for studio art majors. Graphic Design, Illustration, and Animated Arts majors will have separate second year requirements. It is recommended that all students take courses related to their intended major and receive advising.
